#### OPPORTUNITY FOR THE PUBLIC TO DIALOGUE WITH THE BOARD

Topic – Participation Fees

Dr. Gase spoke about the benefits of pay to participate revenue as a budget reduction measure and the district's financial status when implemented.

Mr. Barber spoke about a community service program to waive fees for student volunteers. He also spoke about adjusting the capital improvements setaside in the five-year forecast to absorb the financial impact of eliminating all fees and the importance of both academic and extra-curricular activities.

Miss Feld spoke about the benefits of a volunteer program for the community, needy students and team bonding.

Mrs. Perry spoke about pay to participate revenue and extra-curricular expenditure amounts. Students and donors contribute about \$75,000 or 20% of the district's annual general fund expenditures for extra-curricular personnel. Students also contribute about \$85,000 or 17% of the district's annual general fund expenditures for classroom materials.

Miss Kidwell spoke about the benefits of a volunteer program waiving payto-participate fees.

Mr. Henry spoke about eliminating all pay-to-participate fees and requiring community service from all student participants. He also spoke about encouraging all students to participate regardless of cost and the importance of extra-curricular activities.

Dr. Hoyda spoke about replacing mandatory coursework fees with student service rather than replacing elective extra-curricular fees. He also spoke about the state's report card grade based on academic performance, not athletics.

Mr. Perez spoke about establishing the appropriate parameters for all student
