- The Boys 8th grade basketball team won the SBC Lake Division

Student Representative Report championship on Saturday February 15th, defeating Bellevue 30-29. Congrats to the 8th grade boys and Coach Don Ferstler on an amazing undefeated season.

- Boys' Bowling represented Tornado nation very well, but unfortunately struggled at Sectionals.
- Girls' Bowling did not advance to Districts as a team, but freshman Danielle Rosenbauer will advance to Districts Saturday at Wapakoneta as an individual.
- Despite finishing fifth in the Lake Division team standings with 124 points, Columbian claimed more individual SBC titles (three) than any other team at Saturday's SBC Tournament. Brett Minnick won at 126 pounds, Maddox Simcoe at 132, and Brody Conley became a back to back SBC Champion by winning at 152. Joey Simcoe finished second at 170 pounds to end his SBC career as a four-time placer and two-time champion. Other Columbian placers included Luc Busdeker (eighth, 138), C.J. Poole (seventh, 145) and Kane Mears (fifth, 220).
